#### News from the Board of Directors

At the reconvened Annual Meeting on January 20, 2016, by unanimous vote, all members of the Board were reelected to serve Walnut Ridge for another year.



- Level Green Landscaping has been contracted to care for our grounds (common area mowing, fertilizing, etc.) for 2016.
- Striping of parking spaces and curbs were painted in December.
- The Board met with representatives from Level Green to discuss its snow removal performance during the January blizzard and ways to improve their performance.
- BGE was made aware of several light poles in the community which were out.
- Proposals are being solicited for sidewalk concrete repair and tree work.
- The Board continues to review A&E applications received from homeowners for contemplated exterior changes to their homes.

# **Does Your Household Have** 3 or More Vehicles?



The Walnut Ridge Parking Space Guidelines (available on the Walnut Ridge website) say:

"There are a limited number of parking spaces throughout the Community which are designated as "Visitor.". These parking spaces are for Visitors. Residents should not park in these spaces."

Our community has parking spaces for 2 vehicles per unit. If you have more than 2 vehicles associated with your residence, you cannot park any additional vehicles at any time in a parking space designated for visitors. A vehicle registered to an owner or resi-(Continued on page 2)

dent of Walnut Ridge cannot park in a visitor space. You cannot rotate one of your vehicles and exchange it for another of your vehicles in a visitor space. Visitor spaces are strictly for visitors. No resident should park in a visitor space.

Our Parking Space Guidelines also say that a vehicle may be towed if it is

"... parked longer than three (3) days or 72 hours in a parking space designated "Visitor."

This applies to **any vehicle** parked in a visitor space. If the vehicle happens to be registered to a homeowner and that vehicle is habitually parking in a visitor space, **it will be towed**.





#### A Pain In the Drain

Homeowners are responsible for the maintenance of their sewer pipes to the County's main sewer pipe (usually in front of your house under the street.)

Because these pipes are buried and not visible, homeowners usually are not aware of the potential problems that tree roots can have on these pipes.

One sign that your sewer pipe might be having a problem is hearing gurgling noises from the toilet bowl or slow flowing drains. A complete blockage can occur if no action is taken to remove the roots/blockage. If this happens, you're looking at some very costly repairs.

Be proactive and consult a local plumbing company to schedule an assessment of your sewer pipe. Routine cleaning of your sewer pipe could prevent these costly repairs. Most plumbers are familiar with these procedures and might even offer a sewer pipe maintenance policy. And just a reminder - it's always wise to get at least 3 quotes on any service.

# Making Any Architectural Changes? Don't Forget To Obtain Approval First!

Our governing documents require all proposed architectural changes require approval before any work is started. The importance of this requirement cannot be overstated when you consider the reason for such a restriction. Membership in a community association requires compliance to pre-existing conditions and regulations. One of the biggest advantages of these conditions is the protection of our property values. The value of your home is directly related to the condition, appearances and aesthetics of our community as a whole. By regulating the kind and types of architectural changes that can be done, our Association is better able to maintain our property values. Getting approval for all proposed architectural changes is not just a good idea to protect your investment, it is a requirement! #### HOW TO REMOVE AND CLEAN YOUR ORIGINAL WINDOWS AND SCREENS

If your home has the original windows and screens which were installed by the builder, follow these directions to remove the sliding portion of your window and your window screen easy cleaning.

Note before you start: Windows and Screens must be removed from the **inside** of your home. The sliding window must be removed **first** before removing the screen.

Remove the Sliding Window: \*Unlock the window and slide the window almost all the way and grab the sides of the panel with your hands. Lift up on the window, pushing the entire panel up into the top track. Swing the bottom of the panel out over the bottom track and then pull the panel down to remove it.



Now, Remove the Screen: Once the window is out, use the tabs on the screen to gently push to one side. A hidden spring-like mechanism on the side of the screen will compress allowing the screen to loosen. Pull the screen in toward you and remove. If your screen no longer has the rubber tab, carefully grasp the screen frame and push gently to one side.

Always remove screens from inside your home. Trying to remove them any other way will surely bend the screen's frame!

\*The window panel is a bit heavy, may be difficult to grasp and can be awkward for just one person to remove safely. So, use extra care and caution (and maybe someone to help you). When removing this panel, leather or rubber gloves can give you a better grip on the window frame and help to make the job easier.
