Reminder to Homeowners! Your next quarterly assessment payment is due January 1st.

- Annual Meeting: The annual meeting will be reconvened on January 17th as quorum was not present on November 29th.
- Budget Meeting: The budget meeting went forward on November 29th as quorum by board members was present. During discussion, it was noted that assessments have not been increased in the past 4 years. In order to maintain healthy reserve funds and to keep up with rising costs, it was deemed necessary to increase quarterly assessments for 2024. By law, assessments may be increased by 10% per year, but it was decided to only increase assessments by 3% (an additional \$7.50/qtr.) beginning January 1st.
- The project to address the erosion in the common area between 1353 and 1355 Hazel Nut was completed in late October. *(Continued on page 2)*

- Annapolis Tree has been contracted to perform significant trimming and tree removal in mid-January, weather permitting.
- Amendments were added to our current landscaping contract to provide for aeration and overseeding in common areas, replacement of aged plantings and regular trimming/push back of overgrown vegetation behind homes.
- Snow removal contract with Level Green is in place for the 2023-2024 season and snow stakes were placed in various locations throughout the community.
- ACC Requests: The Board received, reviewed and responded to approximately
 9 ACC requests since the Fall 2023 newsletter publication.

About Association Assessments

Association assessments are paid by *every* homeowner in Walnut Ridge. Assessments are used for private road upkeep, snow removal, maintenance of the tot lot area and playground equipment, association administrative expenses such as accountant services, legal fees, property management fees and common area upkeep such as landscaping, tree trimming, street lighting, sidewalk repairs and other miscellaneous expenses.

Assessments are due on the 1st day of each quarter and are considered late if received after the 15th of the month it is due. If payment is made by check or automatic bill pay, please be sure that your payment is adjusted to the new 2024 assessment amount (\$198.50). Your payment should be sent to Axos Lockbox, c/o ProCom, P.O. Box 2097, Secaucus, NJ 07096-2097.

- **No Parking** on yellow curbs or you could be towed.
- Trash & Recycling. Trash and recycling containers should be placed at the curb no earlier than 6:00 pm on Monday evenings. Containers should be at the curb before 6 am on Tuesday mornings to ensure pickup.
- Street Lights. Report street light outage at <u>bge.com/outdoorlighting</u> or call 800.685.0123.
- **Discharge of fireworks is prohibited** in Walnut Ridge.
- **Dogs MUST be on leashes** at all times when outside your home.

Pick up will be Wednesday, January 3rd (**not** on Tuesday, January 2nd)

When it snows...

* You are responsible for shoveling your stoop/porch, walkway and sidewalk in front of your home as well as your numbered parking spaces.



- * When shoveling your sidewalk and parking spaces, do not throw or place your shoveled snow around the mailboxes. The mail carrier must be able to get to the mailboxes, otherwise, mail will not get delivered.
- * Please do not place large amounts of snow in the street, unless active plowing is taking place.
- * Keep your snow to yourself. Don't toss the snow into your neighbor's parking space or walkway, even if it means you have to carry the shovel of snow a couple of extra feet.
- Please do not remove the Snow Stakes which have been placed along the curbs by our snow removal contractor.

Tips from Anne Arundel County Department of Public Works for Recycling Your NATURAL Christmas Tree

- * Natural garland, wreaths, and Christmas trees are yard waste. They are chipped into mulch, a valuable soil covering.
- * Please remove tree stand, bags, metal ornament hangers, and all decorations. Cut very tall trees in half so that the tree will fit into the contractor's truck.



- * Natural garland, wreaths, and Christmas trees will be collected on your collection day.
- * Yard waste is collected at the curb on your collection day all year round.
- * Put your natural garland, wreaths, and Christmas trees at the curb before 6:00 am on your collection day or bring your items to any one of Anne Arundel County Recycling Centers.

Parking Space Guidelines

The Parking Space Guidelines is an official, enforceable, recorded document which governs parking on our private streets (Almond, Hazel Nut, Peach and Tanook). The Parking Space Guidelines were provided to you when you bought your home or provided to you by your landlord if you rent your home.

Residents are reminded that all parking spaces in the community belong to the Association. Walnut Ridge Drive is a County road and does not belong to the Association. Each home in Walnut Ridge is assigned two (2) parking spaces which are designated for the exclusive use of that unit. There are a limited number of parking spaces throughout the community which are marked "Visitor."

Restrictions outlined in the Parking Space Guidelines include, but are not limited to:

- Vehicles with commercial logos or business advertisements displayed on the vehicle.
- Vehicles with no tags or with expired tags.
- Vehicles which exceed the length of the painted parking space lines and/or are parked in such a way that the vehicle extends over the curb and into the sidewalk area or extends into the street and beyond the painted parking space lines.
- An apparently abandoned vehicle (i.e. no tags or expired tags, poor state of repair).
- No trailers, boats and campers.
- Resident vehicles consistently parked in Visitor Spaces.
- Vehicles without windows on the sides, other than a window for the driver and for the passenger, i.e. "panel vans".

Offending vehicles will be tagged and/or towed.


